There was a library in the temple of Hercules which, according to Gellius, was well supplied with books. Gellius quotes on one occasion from a book of Claudius Quadrigarius in this library.<sup>112</sup> At another time he and a group of friends had gone to the Tiburtine country during the heated season, and were drinking water made...
